AVID Contract

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Classroom Policies, Procedures, & Grading

Entering Class: Gather any necessary materials, quickly find your seat, and begin working on the warm-up /activity posted on the board.

Bathroom Usage: It is best that you use the bathroom during passing times, at break, and at lunch. If an emergency arises you may use a bathroom coupon to use the restroom during class. Unused bathroom coupons will be worth extra credit points at the end of the semester.

Absences: If you are absent, it is your responsibility to make up missed assignments. See the “Absent Work Files” for missed work.

Late Work: Late work is not accepted unless you have an excused absence.

Food & Electronic Devices: Food and drink are not permitted for sanitary reasons. Electronics should not be seen or heard in the classroom.

Exiting Class: In the last five minutes of class, you will wrap up what you are working on, return materials to appropriate locations, and we will summarize our learning for the day. The teacher, not the bell, dismisses you upon completion of these tasks.

Grade Break Down:

- 1) Binder Checks/Agendas
- 2) Tutorial Request Forms (TRFs)/Participation in Tutorials
- 3) Assignments (In class **AND** after school activities, and home assignments)
- 4) Participation and Listening Behavior Points

Positive Learning Environment

Meeting classroom expectations and behaving appropriately in class helps to create a learning environment where you and your classmates feel welcome, safe, and respected.

If you choose to meet the classroom expectations, you will receive a **positive consequence** of earning class listening and participation points. These points are part of your grade and cannot be made up. (If you are absent (excused) they do not count against you as long as you make up the work). Other positive consequences would be words of praise, privileges in the classroom, TRF passes, positive notes and phone calls home, Friday games, and other fun class activities

If you choose not to meet the classroom expectations and distract others from learning, you will be jeopardizing your own grade. Distractions and interruptions in class will cause you to lose your classroom participation and listening points. These points cannot be made up! If you choose not to follow the rules you will receive a **negative consequence**, such as a verbal warning, a change of seat, a student/teacher conference, a phone call home, a detention, and/or parent/guardian meeting.
